

LICKEY END PARISH COUNCIL

History

Nov 1999	Lickey End residents' public meeting. Parish Council proposed
July 2000	Consultation exercise. Bromsgrove District Council decide insufficient support to justify the establishment of a new Parish
July 2000	The petitioners request the Minister to give support in setting up a Parish Council in Lickey End
Sept 2000	Letter from Philip Perry, Policy Advisor, D.E.T.R.
Nov 2000	B.D.C. interpret this as an instruction
Nov 2000	Anti-Parish Group formed, collect over 700 signatures on a petition against a Parish Council for Lickey End. The petition was rejected. The reason given was the decision had been made and could not be changed
Nov 2000	B.D.C. now recommend Lickey End (with the exception of Burcot) is parished
March 2001	AP.C.G. put forward 10 candidates for the election to be held on May 3rd
May 2001	'Foot and Mouth'. Election to now be held on 7th June
June 2001	All 10 'Anti' candidates elected
June 2001	Lickey End Parish Council held its first meeting and submitted a formal request for its own dissolution
June 2001	B.D.C. informed the Parish Council that they would have to await the completion of the periodic electoral review
July 2002	B.D.C. commenced the review. (Section 10-1 of the 1997 Act)
Sept 2002	B.D.C. recommended that a draft be published to the effect that the Parish should be abolished
Dec 2002	B.D.C. forwarded the recommendation to the Minister
Jan 2003	No decision to be made until after the Parish Council elections to be held on the 1st May
May 2003	All 10 'Anti' candidates elected 6 in Lickey End Ward 4 in South Marlbrook Ward
Sept 2003	The Minister rejected the recommendation of the B.D.C. to abolish the Parish and Parish Council
May 2007	All 10 'Anti' candidates elected (unopposed) 6 in Lickey End Ward 4 in South Marlbrook Ward
